

GO CANOEING IN ONE OF THE ISABERG REGION'S 388 LAKES

In addition to the Nissan River, the Isaberg region offers a total of 388 lakes waiting to be explored. Just a stone's throw from Isaberg, you'll find Algustorpasjön. Here, you can rent a canoe, kayak, or SUP and set out to discover the lake and its islands.

GISLAVED

For more paddling adventures in stunning nature, don't miss Norra and Södra Vallsjön or the charming lake system featuring Storemalen, Mörkemalen, Skrivaregårdssjön, Våthultssjön, and Majsjön.

CANOEING AT FEGEN NATURE RESERVE

Fegen Nature Reserve, often referred to as Sweden's southernmost wilderness, is a popular destination for paddlers. Here, you can enjoy the tranquility, go fishing, swim, or simply relax at a scenic campsite.


The nature reserve includes both Lake Fegen and its surrounding forests. Deep coniferous forests enclose the lake, but in a few places, there are beech woodlands that are incredibly beautiful during the spring budding season.

We recommend a stop at Sandvik, a hidden gem on the eastern shore of Lake Fegen.

COMBINE CANOEING WITH HIKING

For those who want to experience the Småland landscape in different ways, we recommend combining canoeing with a hiking adventure.

For example, you can paddle on the Nissan River from Öreryd or Isaberg down to Gislaved, then hike back along Gislavedsleden, which is part of the Smålandsleden trail.

CANOEING TIPS

- Always wear a life jacket
- Bring plenty of water with your on your canoe trip. You won't necessarily find water to fill your bottles during the trip.
- There are no electrical sockets at the picnic/camping areas, so bring a power bank to charge your phone.
- Remember that even
 waterproof phones sink
 and may be hard to find if
 you drop them in the water.
 You might want to use a
- waterproof phone case.Consider using waterproof barrels/bags when packing.
- It's useful to bring a bow saw or pruning saw and an axe.
- Stay away from the wild animals and show respect.
- Only light fires in designated areas. There is a supply of wood at the picnic/camping areas. It is forbidden to chop down trees. After lighting a fire, extinguish it completely with water.
- Only pitch your tent at camping areas or next to wind shelters, never on private plots, pastures or planted areas.
- Respect the natural environment.
 Don't leave any litter.
- You can bring dogs with you to outdoor areas, but they are not permitted to run loose in the forests or countryside between 1 March–20 August

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FREEDOM TO ROAM

The Swedish Right of Public Access gives everyone the right to roam freely in nature, including on private land, for instance to pick wild berries and mushrooms. You are allowed to walk across private property to access fishing waters, and to temporarily use a jetty if it is situated outside a private plot. You are allowed to access the shore, swim and temporarily moor a boat at a beach that doesn't belong to a private plot and isn't a protected bird habitat. You can also pitch a tent for a couple of days in the wild. Don't leave any rubbish and be careful if you light a fire. In protected natural areas, special rules apply that are displayed for visitors to read at the site. For more information about the Swedish Right of Public Access, visit naturvardsverket.se

HIKING

CANOE TRAIL NISSAN

Experience the enchanting nature of Småland by canoeing on the Nissan, a waterway that offers calm waters and beautiful surroundings. You can choose to explore shorter sections of the trail or challenge yourself with a long-distance journey of approximately 72 km. Whether you are an experienced paddler or a beginner, Nissan provides a peaceful and nature-close experience for everyone.





CAMPING AREAS WITH WIND SHELTERS

There are seven camping areas along the Nissan where you can stay overnight: Öreryd, Algustorpasjön, Bäckshult, Båraryds By, Rönnegården, Ågård and Skeppshult. All these camping areas have wind shelters, firewood, barbecue facilities, rubbish bins and toilets. At Värö in Algustorpasjön, there is also a campsite managed by the County Administrative Boards of Sweden, as it is located within a nature reserve.

You need a canoe cheque to use the camping areas along the route. Canoe cheques can be purchased at selected sales points along the Nissan.





PADDLE DISTANCE BETWEEN WIND **SHELTERS**

In total, it is approximately 72 km from Öreryd to Skeppshult.





CANOE TRIP WITH OVERNIGHT **ACCOMMODATION**

If you want to paddle a long distance over several days, we recommend starting in Öreryd or Isaberg and paddling down to Skeppshult. This takes about 4-5 days. Along the canoe trail, you'll find many lovely camping areas with wind shelters where you can spend the night.


THE NATURE ALONG THE NISSAN

to Gislaved Industrial Museum.

The river Nissan's most distinctive characteristic is its meandering course, which was formed by a slow geological process that constantly changes the watercourse and its immediate surroundings. Most parts of the river Nissan are slow-flowing. In a few places, primarily in the northern parts of the municipality, the river's slow-flowing, meandering course is interspersed with slightly faster flowing stretches where it is still possible to fish for local Nissan salmon trout. The Nissan offers many excellent spots for angling, spin fishing and fly fishing. The natural environment along the river is rich in fauna and flora. You might spot wild roe deer and elks grazing along the river banks. You'll pass several fascinating nature reserves along the Nissan, such as Isaberg, a hill consisting of primary rock, and the nature reserves Värö, Ettö and Villstad kyrkby. Put your canoe cheque in the letterbox when you arrive at the camping area. You can get more information at the sales point.
